Learning Objectives

1. Understand that family safety and self-sufficiency are linked goals among agencies, nonprofits and families
2. Know the components of a strength based services plan, which includes goals & objectives, case reviews, transitions and aftercare services
3. Understand the statutory and regulatory requirements of Child Welfare Services, CalWORKS, job and employment services and eligibility programs
4. Develop a service plan, which balances family, informal community and formal agency resources and encourages communication between all involved
5. Tailor services to the uniqueness of a family's needs with the family and other disciplines
6. Link families with a comprehensive, diverse and community-based network of supports and services in order to achieve family safety and long-term self-sufficiency
7. Share and promote your county's strategies to coordinating plans, while learning about other counties' approaches
8. Understand and respect the legitimacy of the other discipline's goals & objectives
9. Honor the family's expertise and value of involvement in case planning
10. Value developing a service plan which is family focused, needs driven, community connected and strengths-based
