Why evaluate?

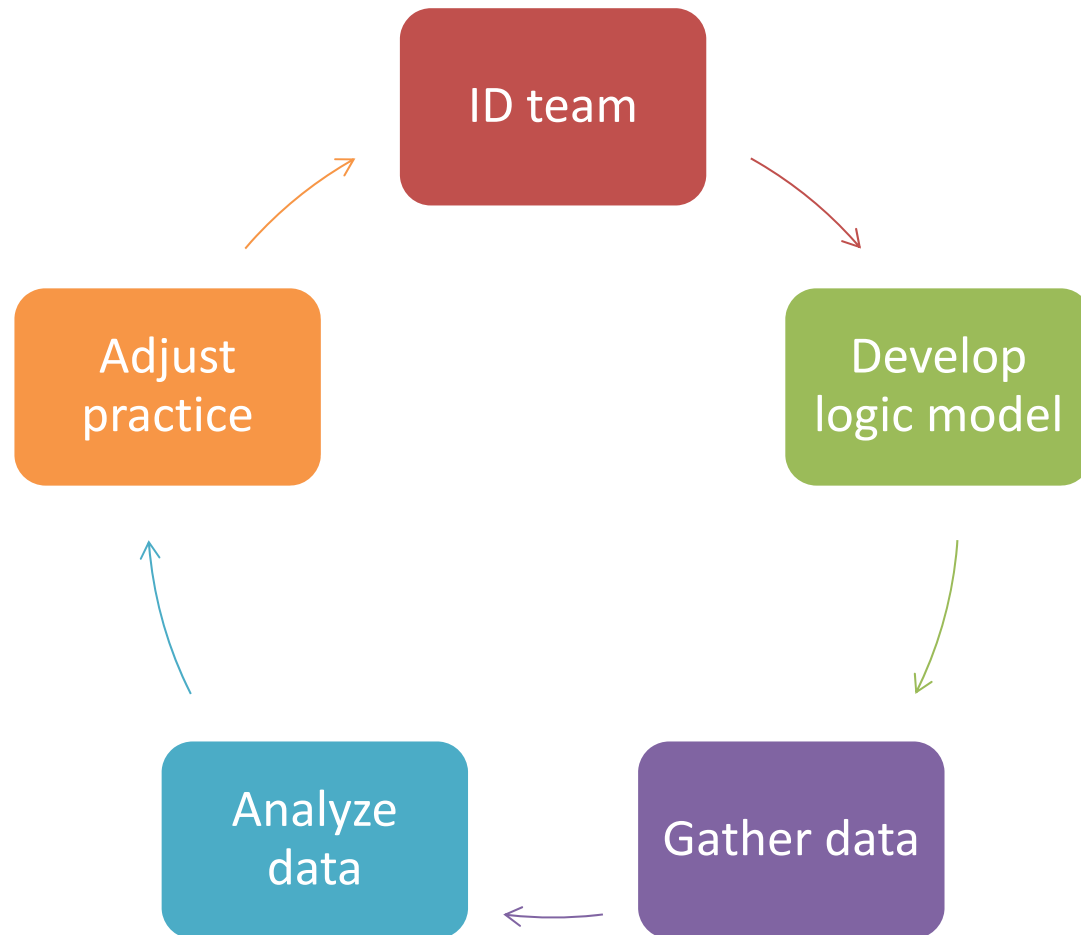
- Develop clarity re. program's effectiveness

Linkages Evaluation Philosophy

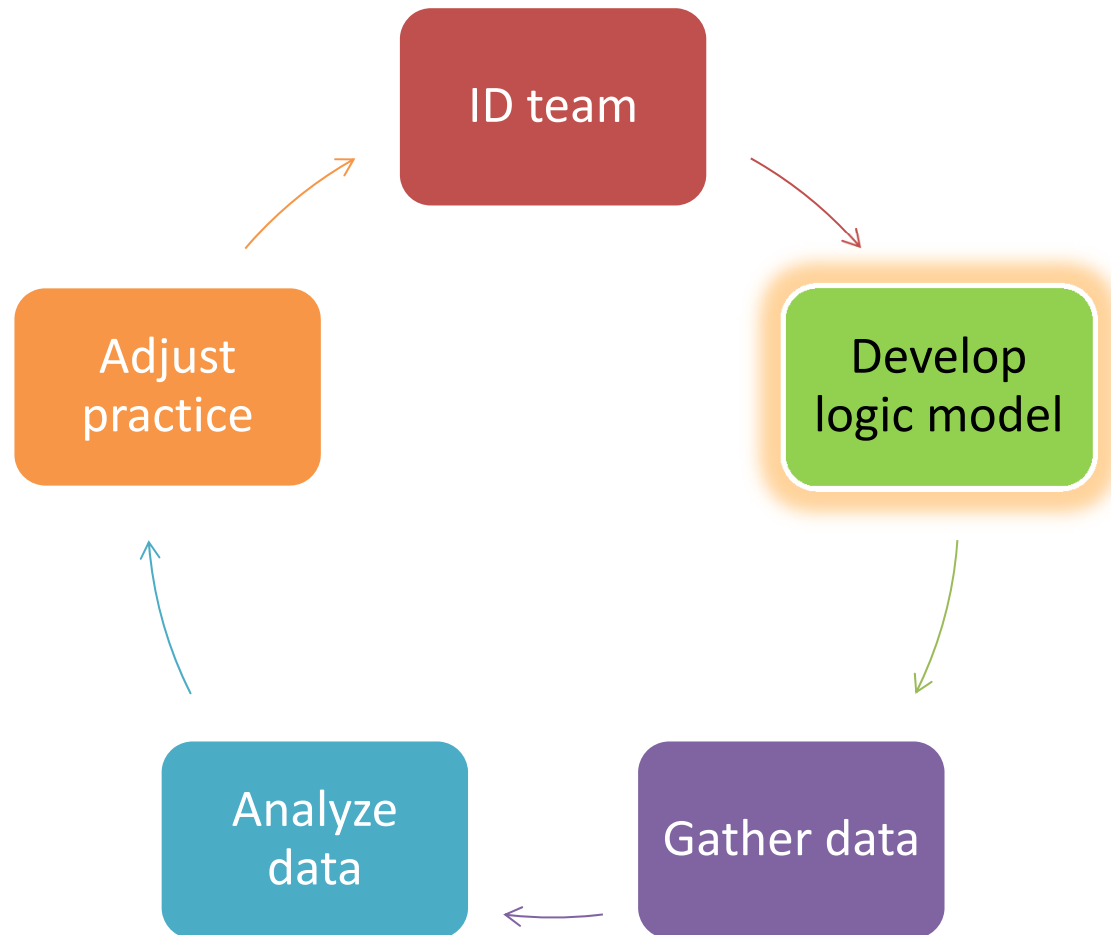
- Partnership of shared expertise

“.. a simple diagram that communicates the rationale for why a program will work.”

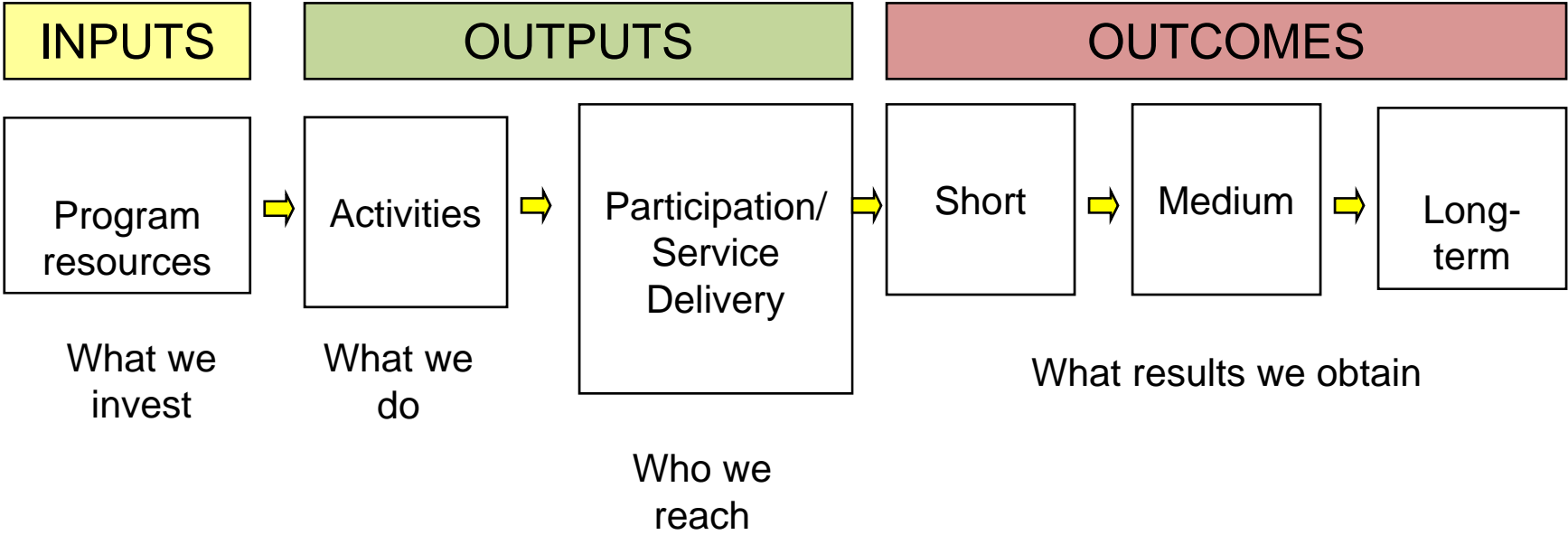

What is a Logic Model?

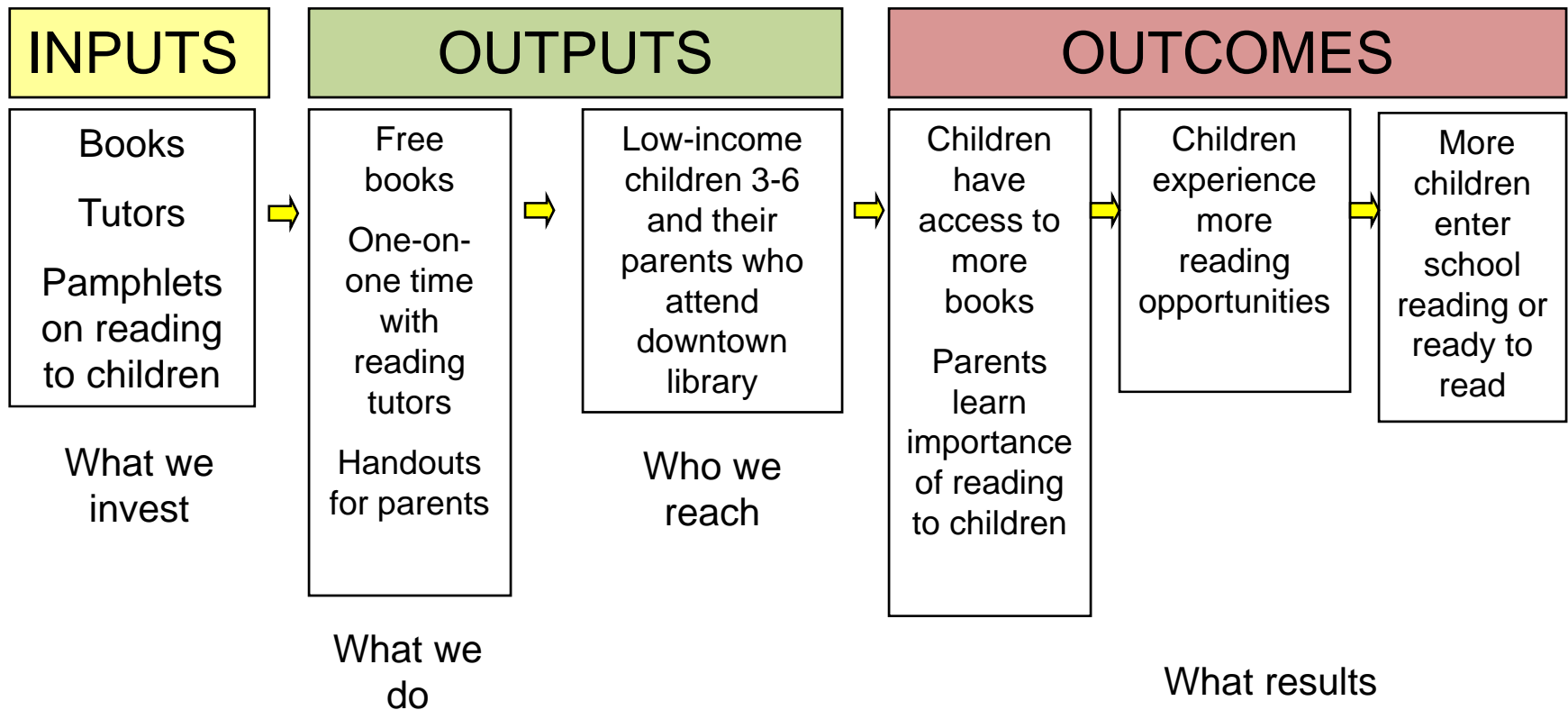
“.. A visual representation of your **theory of change**...(the chain of reasoning that explains why you believe your project will make a difference....)”

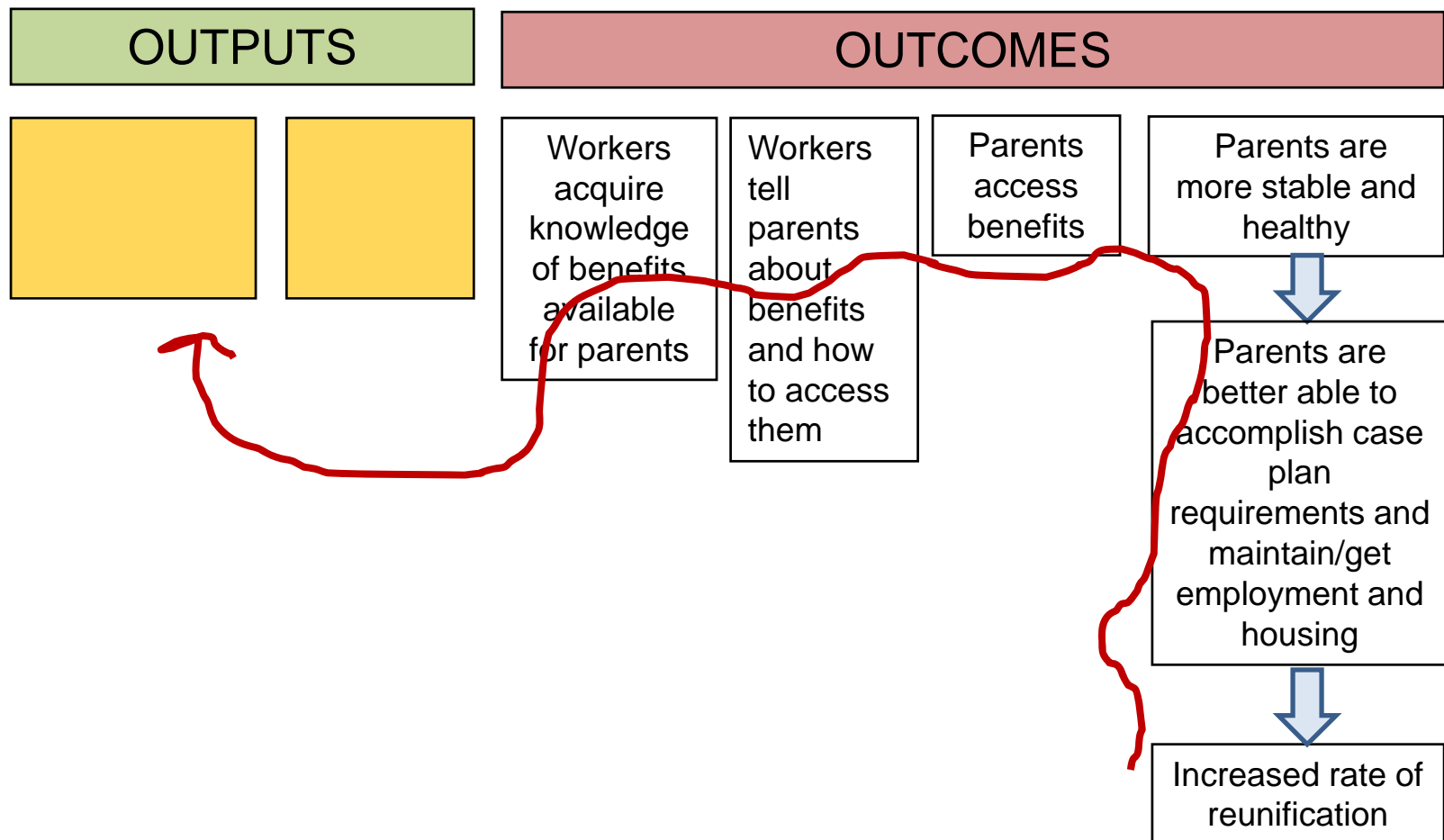

Value for Planning

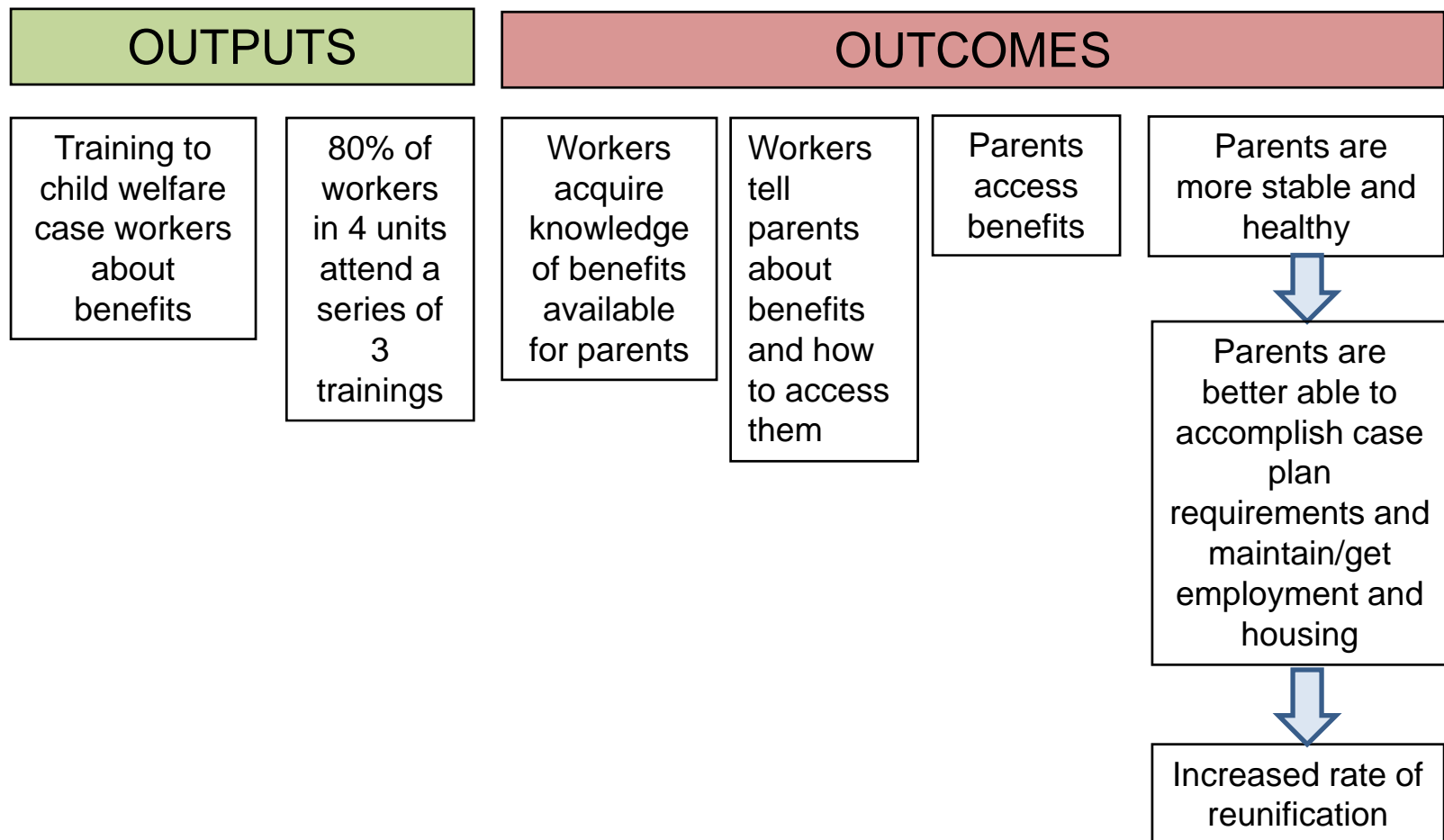
Clarify appropriate program elements and activities

Involve stakeholders and team members in planning process



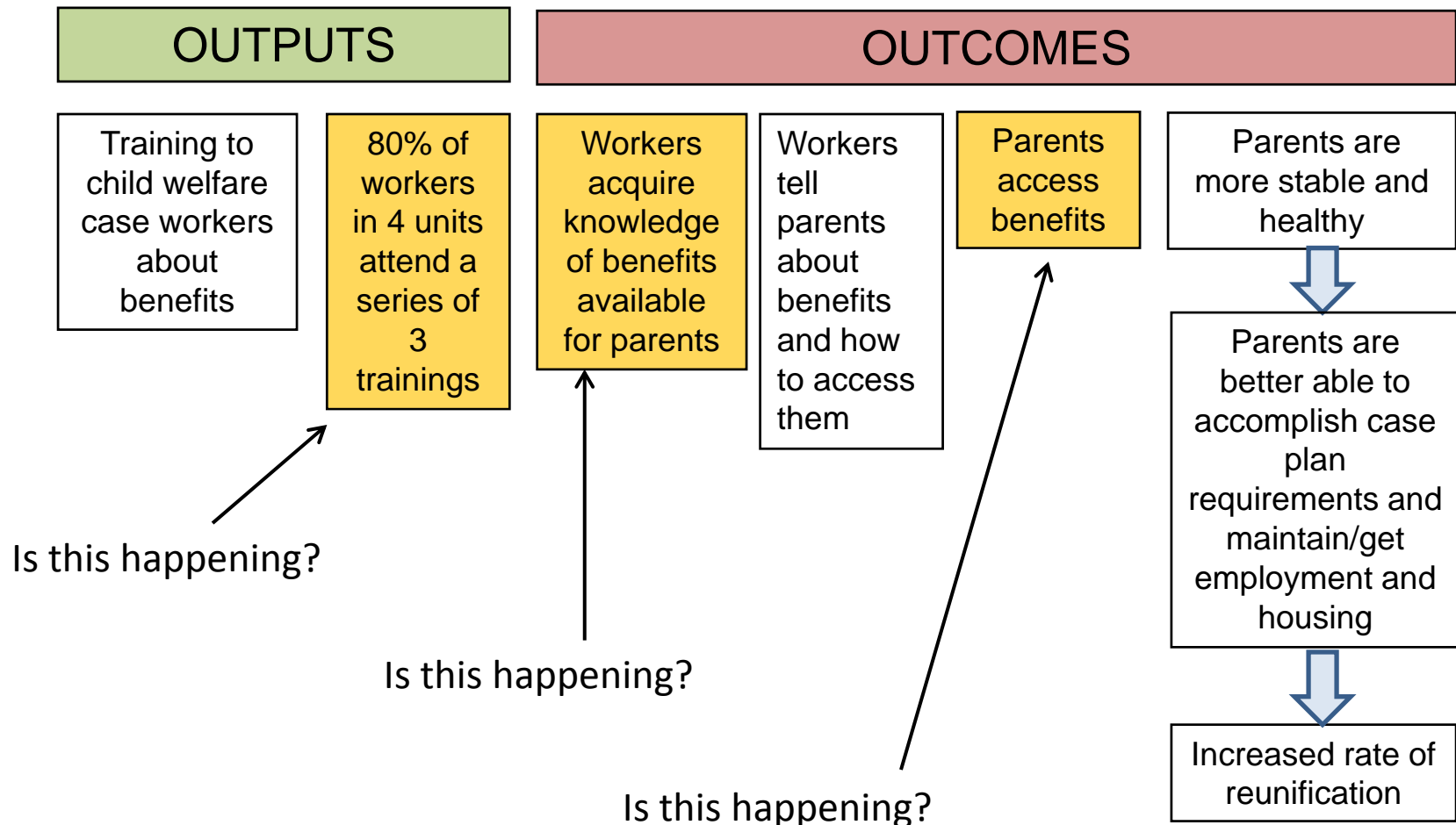
Value for Planning

Communicate with funders about potential of program to effect change



Value for Implementation

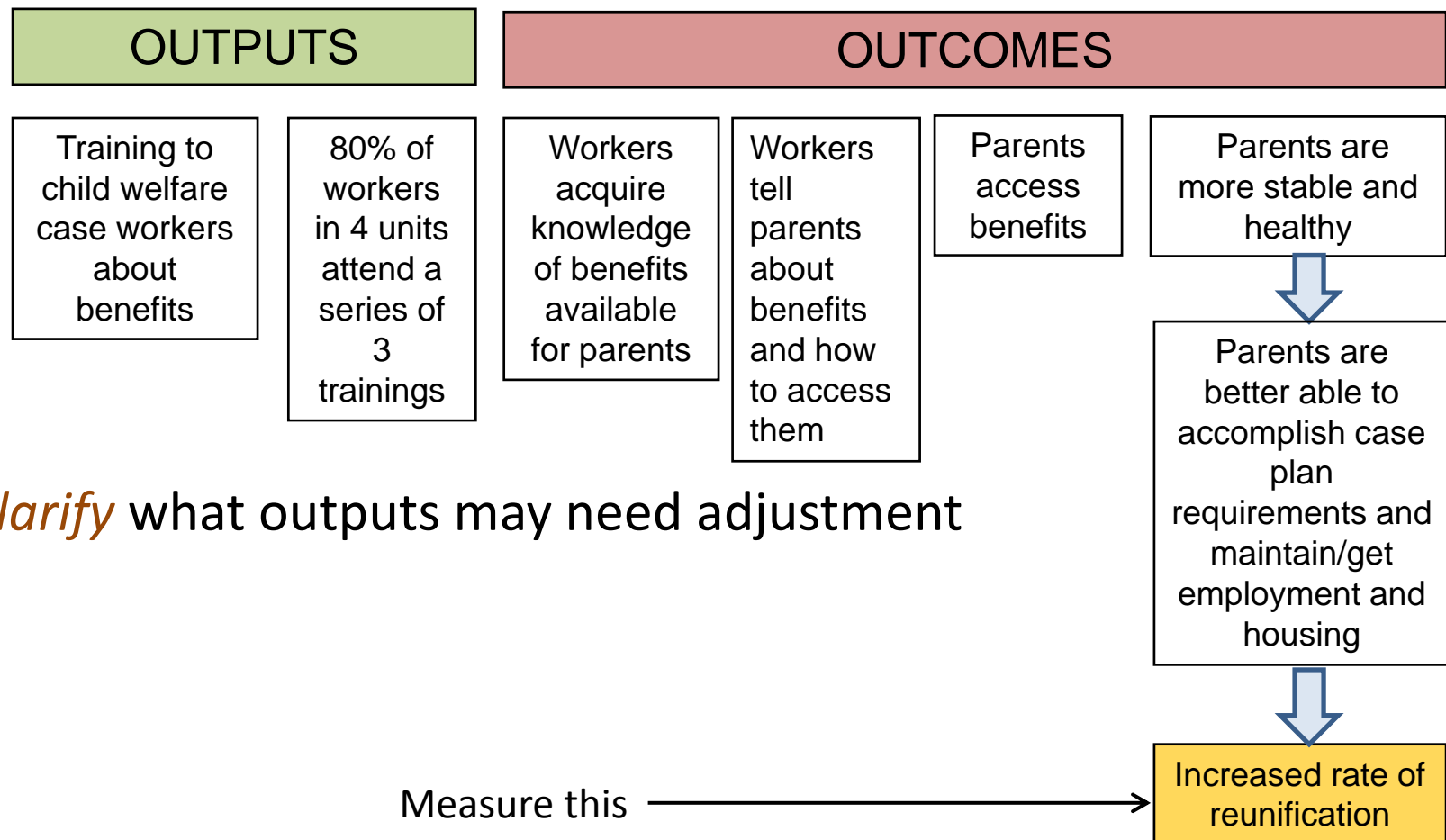
Clarify necessary program elements to monitor
Communicate with others about program fidelity



Value for Evaluation

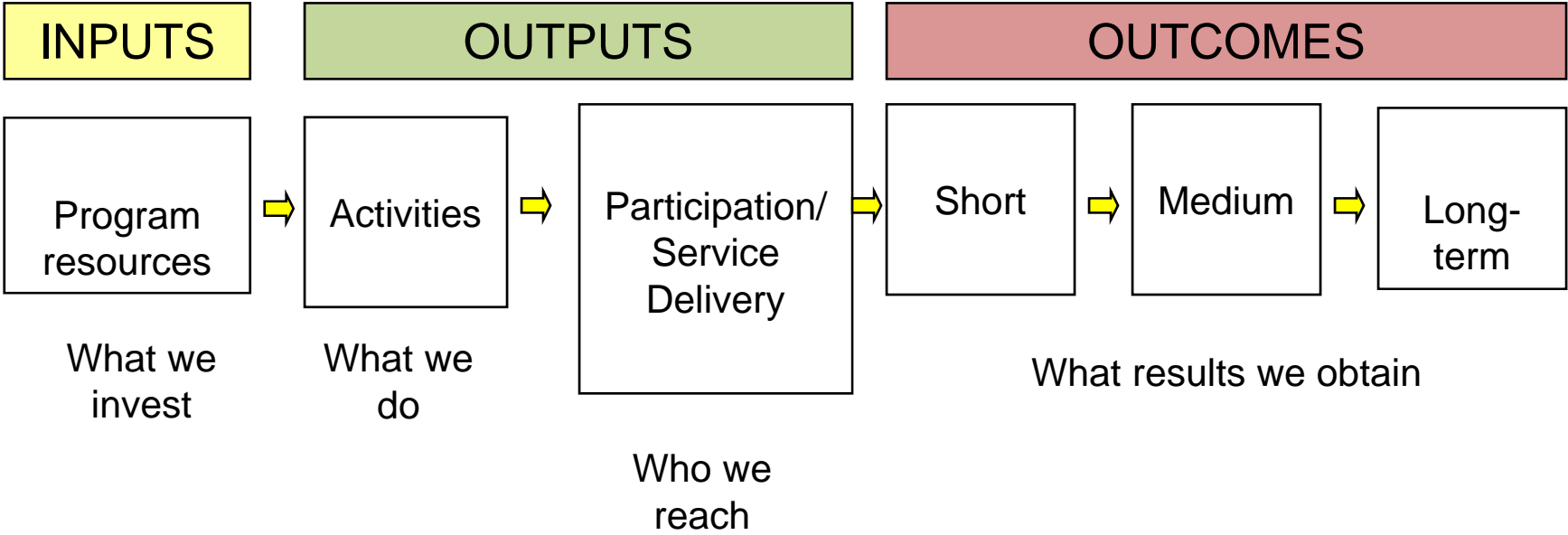
Clarify theory of change to support evidence of effectiveness

Communicate with stakeholders about program value



Clarify what outputs may need adjustment
